## From The BTC Historian:

Fellow Members,

Today I would like to tell you a little bit about one of our Longtime Members who not only is one of our best at many sports but also donated some of his time to help our Club moving forward. Bob Kennedy has had two stints in the BTC. First, he was a member from 1994-2009 and then again from 2013 until the present. In 1994 his Sponsors were Longtime Members Chuck Martino and Jim Fowler who knew Bob from golf and banking.

When Bob came back in 2013 his Sponsors were Rich Schroeder and Kevin Bewley.

Bob just finished his term as President of the Club in 2025.

During his first term in the Club, he was a golfer and a racquetball player. I know that Bob was one of the better racquetball players, even though I did not play it, but by looking at the weekly scores. He was always near the top. When it came to golf Bob really excelled. It did not hurt that his Family have been Members at Olympia Fields C.C. since 1968. Last year Bob and Former BTC Member, John Warta, won the Member/Guest Tournament that Olympia Fields played.

When Bob came back to the Club he tried bowling, tennis and golf until his knee forced him to concentrate strictly on his golf game. That has not diminished as Bob has won the Division 1 BTC Championship on a couple of occasions. Before he stopped competing in the other Sports Bob also was Champion twice in racquetball and in tennis.

Besides being a BTC Officer the past four years Bob has helped with our Italian Day Event, dressing up as Elvis and giving every Member and Guest a chance to hit a Closest to the Pin at Glenwoodie C.C. I beat him for the first time last year. During this time Bob also worked for the Village of Frankfort. First as a Clerk for five years and then as a Trustee for the Town for eight years starting in 2008.

His Son is 30 and Daughter 32 as well as his 4-year-old Granddaughter who lives in Greenville Indiana. But I am sure that Bob will always want to be beating our scores with the BTC out on the golf course on a Tuesday Afternoon.
